

A05 EXTRA EQUIPMENT

Equipment

While improvisation is OK, having the right kit definitely makes your life easier. Having said the Monk seems to be capable of making a radio out of some gum, a kid's toy and a car battery.

BODY ARMOUR

EoD Suit

This is a heavy duty suit designed to protect bomb disposal personnel when approaching a device. Wearing this converts movement from a fast action to a slow action and imposes two penalties on attempting to move further.

FIELD GEAR

Fatigues (plain)

The older non-camouflage version of uniforms. These are identical to those in the rules but do not give the bonus for camouflage. It can also be used to reflect drab civilian clothes.

Ghillie Suit

This sniper smock (named after the Scottish name for gamekeepers) consists of a standard smock which has been extensively modified by sewing on strips of camouflage material and hessian. It is not intended for everyday wear as the strips will snag and catch during movement (earing it long term should result in the GM imposing a penalty for the inconvenience and fatigue). It provides a +2 modifier to recon rolls for setting ambushes and staying undetected. This bonus can also be used if moving a maximum of 1 hex in an action if prone.

Poncho

This item can either be worn as a waterproof or can be used to make a one man tent (giving a bonus of +1 to survival rolls for making camp. Includes tent pegs, bungees and string.

COMMUNICATIONS GEAR

Generic equipment

Field telephone handset

Most armies use landlines for communication as they do not emit a radio signature allowing detection. These require a land line cable to connect them. Pre war these were usually specifically

manufactured, by 2000 these are often dismantled from vehicles such as the M60 (that had one mounted at the rear to allow infantry to communicate with the tank commander without having to climb up on top of the vehicle) or even modified civilian phones. Note that it is easy to tap into a line with a set to listen in covertly. Also lines are easy to break and must then be physically fixed.

Landline

Cable such as the British D10 for use with field telephones. Figure below is per 500m of cable.

British Military Radios

UK/PRC349

A small section to platoon level radio that incorporates a pouch allowing it to be worn on the front or rear. Requires one hand to operate the pressel switch to transmit but incorporates a throat mike allowing near silent transmitting..

UK/PRC351

A backpack FM radio with 1841 channels in 25KHz steps that can also be vehicle mounted. When used as a man portable version it is usually fitted to the same frame as the GS burgan. Wearing this prohibits the use of a backpack, It features two headsets, one of which is the same headset as the UK/PRC349 and the other is usually a traditional handset (the radio operator usually uses the headset and the platoon or company commander the handset (note that these are interchangeable and any can fit any UK radio set).. It can be upgraded to the UK/PRC352 with a booster kit (including static antenna). A remote function allows the connecting of two radios via landline that allows their use as a telephone or as a rebroadcast station (meaning the signal is sent from the first but broadcast from the second.

Signalling Gear

Mini-flares

This is a cut down version of the signal flare that uses a small pen sized launcher and six flares. There are nearly invisible in daylight and at night do not provide any illumination.

Smoke Grenades

These use chemicals to generate smoke in varying colours. They have a blast of C for generating smoke but do no damage (although they do generate heat at the grenade meaning combustible materials may be set on fire).
